## Roman Coins: Facts \& Figures



1 Aureus = 25 Denarii (plural of Denarius)
1 Denarius = 4 Sestertii
1 Sestertius $=2$ Dupondii $=4$ Ases

## What's it worth today?

1 Denarius had roughly the purchasing power of $£ 30$.
A Roman Legionary soldier earned 300 Denarii a year, whilst a Centurion earned 4500 Denarii a year. A stone mason could earn 50 Denarii a day, farm labourers earned 25 Denarii a day, whilst a teacher could earn up to 250 Denarii a month per pupil!

## What could it buy you?

One loaf of bread $=1 / 2$ a Sestertius
$1 / 2$ litre of olive oil $=40$ denarii
$1 / 2 /$ litre of fine wine $=30$ denarii
1 lemon = 25 denarii
1 chicken = 30 denarii
1 lb of beef $=8$ denarii
Pair of boots $=60-100$ denarii
1 male slave $=30,000$ denarii
1 lb of pure white silk $=12,000$ denarii
1 racehorse $=100,000$ denarii
